Make your own Daffodil

It's easy! Follow the instructions and cut out the template to see your very own daffodil flower come to life.



What you will need:

- 1 x large paperclip
- Stem, leaf, petal, flower and trumpet templates
- · Coloured textas, coloured paper, pencils or crayons (optional)
- Sticky tape or glue

Method:

- You can colour in your own daffodils or photocopy the templates provided onto coloured card or paper.
- Cut out rectangular stem and twist into narrow cone shape of roughly 1cm thick at the top and no more than 3cm thick at the base. Secure it with clear tape along the edge.
- Cut out leaf template and snip along the dotted lines making sure not to cut too much.
- Push slots A & B together to form a cross shape '+', make sure both edges are flat to table surface.
- Carefully cut along the dotted lines on the base of the stem.
- Slot the leaves into the stem and adjust to stand straight, then secure with clear tape or glue.
- Cut out each petal shape and placing one on top of the other and using a hole punch, carefully pierce a hole in the middle of them.
- Twist one set of petals so that you can see all 6 petals.
- Cut out the trumpet, and fold the cut-out into a cone shape.

 Make line A & B meet to form a straight edge and fix with clear tape.
- Fold the tab of the trumpet (C) in half and thread through holes in the petals securing at back with clear tape.
- Make one bend in the paperclip to form an 'L' shape and thread one half through the paper trumpet & petals and the other half down into the stem. You can also sticky tape the flower to the stem.
- Secure the trumpet with tape if required.


